






Emptying the Skip

There has been a bit of an ongoing joke around the club that I have more items in need of repair than in my running box. While this is not quite true, there have been times when I have considered a larger skip to hold them all. In an attempt to avoid the cost of a new skip, I decided to move some items through the repair shop. First cab off the rank, an easy one, to boost the ego, was a 4-6-0 Thomson B1 (Viscount Ridley) a fine loco from Bachman, catalogue no 31-701. This loco has always been a reliable part of my rolling stock and had been relegated to the "Skip O' Death" by a small transport accident. The hook on the front of the tender that locates under the loco was broken and a previous repair attempt by gluing had not lasted very long. Determined to make a better job I decided to connect the loco and tender as on the prototype with a drawbar.

On inspection, both the loco and tender had the correct mouldings for this approach; the loco actually had a hole whereas the tender required some delicate use of a drill. I removed the screw that retained the remains of the hook and drilled a slot for the new drawbar. Then a thin strip of metal was fashioned to fit between the two mouldings. I drilled a hole in one end to suit a small screw, this allowed me to fix the drawbar to the loco and whilst holding everything in position I marked the hole for the other end. Assembly required a dose of bravery pills as the mounting lug for the original hook must be removed to provide access to insert the screw in the new drawbar.

Having passed the point of no return by removing the lug, I inserted the last screw and after checking for clearances, placed the now connected loco and tender on some track to admire my handiwork. Shock, horror, the front wheels of the tender were floating a scale 400mm above the track. On closer inspection, I could see that the moulding on the tender was set lower than the mating spot on the loco, causing the drawbar to lift the front of the tender. A quick redesign of the drawbar to include an appropriate step put the wheels back on the track.

While performing this modification / repair I also shortened the chasm between loco and tender to improve Occupational Health and Safety for the crew and having got it down to where the tender buffers just touched on full swing it was then off to the clubrooms for a few test laps to check for clearances on curves and through points. With all tests passed, I disassembled and then painted the drawbar black to hide it even more, while the loco is in the shops perhaps I should keep going and add brake rods, a fall plate and a crew and lights and...hmm, there is always tomorrow.
